Also , prepare well before each lesson-it is critical to prepare for teaching classes so that teacher can deliver productive, engaging lessons to students and maximize the effectiveness of time and resources. While preparation for educating may include factors such as lesson planning and the development of daily activities, it may also include the initial or ongoing training teachers take to gain skills and competency as a teacher.

I made a research based on classroom management methods in my internship. I chose two groups of pupils for research. They were the pupils who study at secondary school. First group was 6th grade and second group was 8th grade and I chose considering effective techniques:

1. Use several kinds of methods each lesson.
