

OPTIONS FOR SOLVING THE PROBLEM OF ISRAELI PALESTINIAN RELATIONS

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An urgent problem of the modern system of international relations is the search for possible solutions to the problem of Israeli-Palestinian relations. These conflict relations have a huge impact on the entire modern system of international relations. We will try to find a system of various possible solutions to this problem based on an analysis of the positions of the main subjects of these relations.

1) The Palestinian nation wants to be an equal nation with all other nations of the world. Therefore, it does not want to give its ethnic national land to another nation, in particular the Jewish nation, when all other nations do not want to give their national land to another nation, including the Jewish nation. The Palestinian nation has the right not to give up its land to another nation, including the Jewish nation. The Palestinian nation strives to create its own sovereign independent state of Palestine on the all territory of Palestine. Therefore, the Palestinian nation is fighting for the liberation of the territory of Palestine from the Zionist conquerors who want to take away its land from it, want to expel, enslave or destroy the Palestinian nation.

2) The Zionists of Israel plan to take possession of the entire territory of Palestine, and expel the Palestinian people into forced emigration to various countries, so that they assimilate in the countries where they emigrate, so that the Palestinian nation disappears as a nation and does not claim to have the land of Palestine returned to it. Thus, in accordance with the plans of the Zionists, the Jewish nation would turn from a “people without land” into a people with land, taking it away from the people of Palestine, but the emerging new people without land, the people of Palestine, would disappear, dissolving into other nations. Zionist slogan: “A land without a people for a people without a land!” (Theodore Herzl) would have been realized in this version of the course of events.

3) The European nations that basically carried out the expulsion (the Roman Empire, in which the Romans and Greeks played the leading role) and the destruction of a

significant part of the Jewish nation (the fascists and anti-Semites of Europe) themselves do not want to allocate part of their national territory for the Jewish nation.

4) Russia, in the form of the USSR, created the Jewish Autonomous Region and thereby allocated for the Jewish nation some of the territories of Siberia it conquered, i.e. part of the ethnic territories of the nations conquered by the Russian Empire, the territories of the Siberian indigenous peoples, but the Jewish nation itself did not want to move there. Russia did this without identifying the consent of these indigenous peoples, that is, in this sense, Russia did not legally allocate this non-Russian territory to the Jewish nation, and the Russian nation, like other European nations, did not want and does not want to allocate its Russian ethnic territory to the Jewish nation.

5) Each of the parties to the conflict, both Israel and Palestine, wants to own the territory of Palestine in full as its ethnic and state territory and build its own national state on it, with its own national language as the state language. The essence of the conflict lies in this.

6) Each side rejects the option of parallel existence of two sovereign, independent states of Israel and Palestine, with the division of the territory of historical Palestine into two approximately equal parts. This option is categorically rejected by the radical parties to the conflict on both sides, although they know that the UN and most states of the world currently consider it appropriate and insist on the implementation of this very option. Unfortunately, Humanity, through the UN, while insisting on this option, is not yet actively considering other, alternative options for solving the problem of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, although this conflict could escalate into a world nuclear war with catastrophic consequences for Humanity.

7) A number of authors also propose the option of creating a single multinational and multi-religious democratic state of Palestine, which would include territorially the entire territory allocated by the UN in 1948 for Israel and the Arab state of Palestine. In terms of population, it would include the entire population of modern Israel and the Gaza Strip, as well as all Palestinians expelled from their territories since 1948 and their descendants, who would be given the opportunity to return to this united state of Palestine. This option is rejected by the leadership of the State of Israel, as well as by the majority of Palestinians, as it is considered impossible due



to the existing relations of mutual enmity and hostility between Jews and Palestinians. The implementation of this project is also complicated by the fact that in this unified state there would be two state languages - Arabic and Hebrew, which the entire population of the unified state of Palestine would need to know. Therefore, this state would not be a nation-state for either the Palestinians or the Jews, while they want nation-states. Thus, this option is now rejected by both sides and is therefore impossible in the modern period.

8) In this situation, the following option is possible as solution to the problem of Israeli-Palestinian relations, when some state and some nation of the world will give (or sell) to Humanity, the UN part of its territory, its ethnic national territory in order to solve the problem of creating on this territory by Humanity, through the UN, a national state of the Jewish nation. This issue must be resolved through a referendum of the citizens of this state and nation, as well as a referendum of the Jewish nation. Similar decisions can be made in parallel by several states and nations of the world, and they can act jointly. At the same time, humanity could consider this issue at the UN General Assembly and make a decision on the implementation of this project. When deciding on the need to implement this project, the UN could coordinate its implementation.

9) If it is not possible to solve the problem according to the options specified in paragraphs 6, 7 and 8, then in this situation, another option for solving this problem is the option of creating by Humanity for the national state of the Jewish nation an artificial island in the World Ocean, in international waters belonging to Humanity, through the political, financial and industrial efforts of Humanity, coordinated by the UN. The Jewish nation, through a referendum, will be able to choose the location of this island and its design in agreement with the UN and other countries of the world. If a certain state agrees to transfer to the UN for these purposes part of the territory of its territorial waters, contiguous zone, exclusive economic zone and shelf, then it will be possible to create not an island, but a peninsula. An island (peninsula) may have an area and population density approximately equal to the area and population density of Singapore.

10) Humanity must also help the long-suffering Palestinian people build their state on Palestinian territory.



11) Visits to the sacred places of all religions in Palestine will have to be ensured by the UN through a special regime for visiting them.

Humanity, through the active work of the UN, could find out the possibilities of implementing the above options and wisely solve the problem of Israeli-Palestinian relations, preventing the catastrophic consequences of the conflict.
